NAMME is proud to announce that we have signed an agreement with the School of Health Sciences at Winston-Salem State University and the North Carolina Alliance for Health Professions Diversity (NCAHPD) to co-sponsor the *Journal of Best Practices in Health Professions Diversity: Research, Education and Policy*.  - b. Encourage journal subscriptions
 - c. Encourage article submissions
 - d. Solicit ads (to advertise vacant positions)
 - e. Solicit reviewers
 - f. Provide advice and assistance on securing an online platform
